Union Ministers Receive Ambassador of the People's Republic of China to Myanmar

State Administration Council Member Union Minister for Home Affairs and Chairman of the National Solidarity and Peacemaking Negotiation Committee (NSPNC) Lt-Gen Yar Pyae and Deputy Prime Minister and Union Minister for Foreign Affairs U Than Swe received Mr. Chen Hai, Ambassador of the People's Republic of China to Myanmar at the respective ministries in Nay Pyi Taw on 13 and 14 November.

During the meeting between Lt-Gen Yar Pyae and the Chinese Ambassador to Myanmar, they discussed issues related to China-Myanmar cooperation with friendship, security, the prevalence of law and order and peace and tranquillity along the China-Myanmar border, measures

against online scams and implementation of Myanmar's peace processes in a frank and cordial manner.

During the meeting between Deputy Prime Minister and Union Minister for Foreign Affairs and the Chinese Ambassador to Myanmar, they cordially exchanged views on the matters of promoting bilateral relations, cooperation in the maintenance of peace and tranquillity as well as the prevalence of law and order along the border areas between Myanmar and China, it is reported.

SAC Information Team Leader Maj-Gen Zaw Min Tun Make Explanations on the Fighting Situation in Northern Shan State, Rakhine State and Loikaw Township of Kayah State



Regarding the fighting situation in northern Shan State, Rakhine State and Loikaw Township of Kayah State, leader of the

State Administration Council Information Team Major General Zaw Min Tun explained as follows –

- Battles broke out in northern Shan State, Loikaw Township of Kayah State, Rakhine State and to the northeast of Tamoenye in the northeastern part of Shan State.
- The military's command in Theinni Township has been taking measures to restore security and safety in the town.
- In Loikaw Township, the terrorist groups so-called KNPP and PDF using heavy weapons attacked Loikaw University and tried to abduct academic staff and students around 8 a.m. on 13 November. Therefore, the local Tatmadaw security personnel had to evacuate the education staff and students to safe places.
- During the evacuation attempts, clashes broke out between the terrorists and the security personnel. Following the clashes, several dead bodies of terrorist insurgents were left and arms and ammunition were seized. The security personnel managed to evacuate the education staff and students and continued taking measures to evacuate the remaining people in the university.
- That was a total cruelty of KNPP members and PDF terrorists to launch attack on a non-military target of the University.
- Also, in Rakhine state, the AA group raided a border guard police outpost of Donpike and the Tatmadaw (Army) and Navy conducted a joint operation.
- In Sagaing Region, Htigyaing township is apparently under control and Tatmadaw personnel are chasing down the combined KIA and AA groups around the Htigyaing township area.
- The terrorists and insurgents are destroying the State and public property as well as education and health sectors rather than their matters in the name of democracy.
- Similarly, they are also invading education and health facilities using them as fortified bases or bunkers in the Sagaing region.

Major General also added that the people, together with the military, must root out and eradicate the terrorists who are carrying out terrorist acts.

She joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Egypt in 1992 and served in various capacities at both headquarters and abroad.

As overseas assignments, she has served as a Second Secretary at the Embassy of Egypt in Hungary from 1997 to 2001, as a Counsellor at the Embassy of Egypt in Kuwait from 2004 to 2008, as a Minister Plenipotentiary at the Embassy of Egypt in Serbia from 2010 to 2014 and as an Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Egypt in Mauritius from 2016 to 2020. Since 2021, she has been serving as Deputy Assistant Minister for the European Union at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Egypt, it is reported.

Notification on One-year Extension of COVID-19 Loan Repayment Period for Livestock Breeding Sectors

The Working Committee to address the impact of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) announced notification no. 2/2023 on 14 November that the government extended the repayment period of COVID-19 loans granted to livestock breeding sectors including Myanmar citizen-owned fish and prawn breeding industries aiming to ensure the circulation of currency flows of local businesses hampered by the COVID-19 pandemic.

It has already been announced that the government extended the repayment period of loans granted to 327 companies/industries further one year when the loan period reached one year on 30 November 2022 under the guidance of the State Administration Council Chairman, it is reported.

of fried fish sauce to security personnel. The foodstuffs were delivered to Lashio via Yangon by a military aircraft, and the officials accepted them.

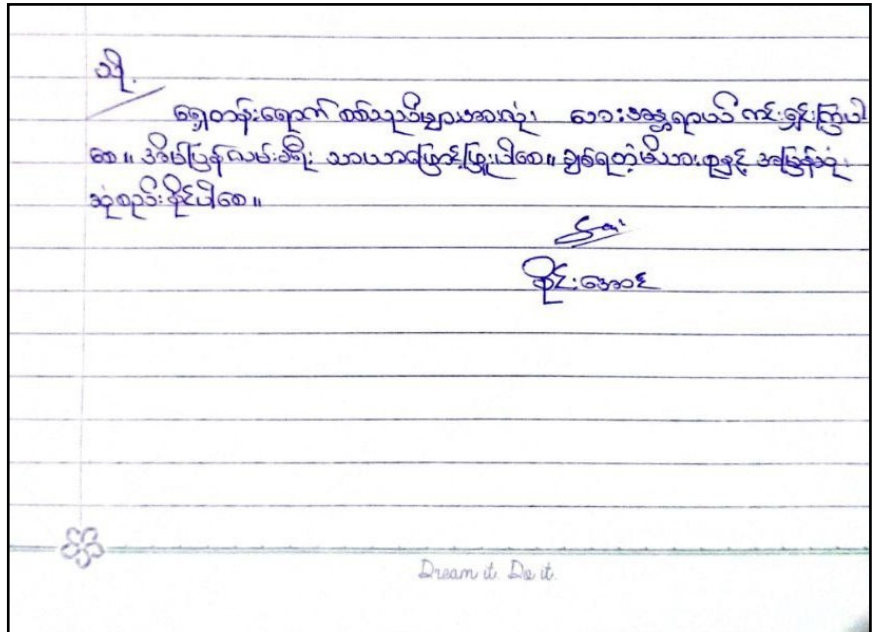
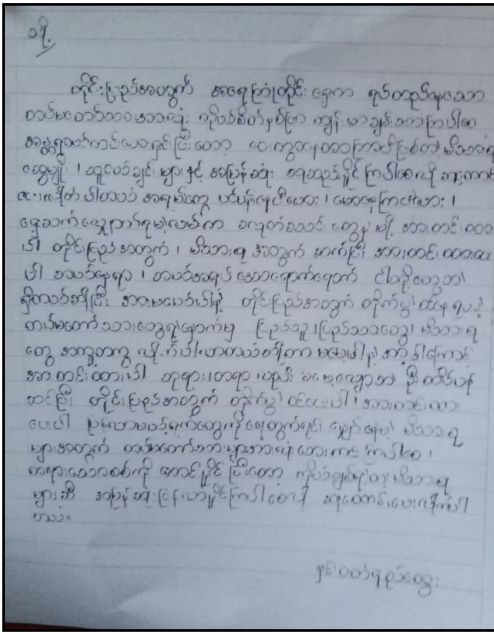

Fuel Sold at Filling Stations in Yangon as Usual



As some filling stations among 146 fuel stations in Yangon were facing higher demand, the Fuel Import, Storage and Distribution Supervisory Committee has been providing fuel from terminals at Thilawa Port in Yangon to these filling stations as follows:

- On 11 November, more than 4000,000 gallons of 92 Ron, more than 100,000 gallons of 95 Ron, more than 170,000 gallons of diesel and more than 270,000 gallons of premium diesel with the use of 334 bowsers have been distributed to the filling stations.

- On 12 November, more than 300,000 gallons of 92 Ron, more than 75,000 gallons of 95 Ron, more than 140,000 gallons of diesel and more than 230,000 gallons of premium diesel have been distributed to these filling stations with the use of 268 bowsers.

Starting from 13 November, fuel is being sold at these filling stations as usual. If necessary, the supervisory committee will supply more fuel to the filling stations in time. So, people can buy fuel as necessary.

The Tatmadaw River-going Mobile Hospital Vessel (ShwePuzun) and riverine boat (Sagu) with the Tatmadaw Mobile medical teams and medical teams from the Ministry of Health comprised of specialists, medical officers and nurses are providing healthcare services to locals from the villages in the delta area along the Ayeyarwady

river in the Ayeyarwady region and the Bago region. Similarly, Tamadaw Sea-going Mobile Hospital Vessel (Thanlwin) is also providing healthcare services to local people from villages of Cocokyun township in the Yangon region, Hainggyikyun township in the Ayeyarwady region and along the Rakhine coast. The Tatmadaw River-going



Mobile Hospital Vessel (ShwePuzun) and riverine boat (Sagu) provided health care services as follows:

- On 9 and 10 November, a total of 1,560 residents in wards and surrounding villages of Myan Aung township of Ayeyarwady region were provided health care services;
- On 11 and 12 November, a total of 1,157 local residents in wards of Htonebo township of Bago region;
- On 13 and 14 November, a total of 897 local residents in wards and surrounding villages of Pyay township of Bago region.

Tamadaw Sea-going Mobile Hospital Vessel (Thanlwin) provided health care services as follows:

- From 8 to 9 November, a total of 1,197 local residents in wards and surrounding

villages of Ngaputaw and Hainggyikyun townships of Ayeyarwady region;

- On 10 and 11 November, a total of 2,009 local residents in wards and surrounding villages of Ngapudaw and Nga-yokekaung township of Ayeyarwady region;
- On 13 November, a total of 1,229 local residents in wards and surrounding villages of Myanaung township of Rakhine state;

A total of 8,049 patients including 2,793 patients who need medical treatments, 695 patients who need surgical operations, 337 patients with obstetric/gynecologic diseases, 410 patients with pediatric diseases, 1,260 orthopaedic diseases, 471 patients with ENT-related diseases, 1,566 patients with eye diseases and 517 patients with dental and oral diseases were given medical treatment at the Tamadaw River-going Mobile Hospital Vessel (ShwePuzun), riverine boat

(Sagu) and Tamadaw Sea-going Mobile Hospital Vessel (Thanlwin). The medics conducted operations on 78 patients who needed to perform general surgery and 65 others who needed to perform eye surgery onboard. Moreover, diagnoses and treatments were also provided to 123 patients who needed to take X-ray scans, 132 patients who needed to take television X-ray scans, 321 patients who needed to receive laboratory tests, 191 patients who needed to take ultrasound scanning and 169 cardiologic patients undergoing ECG procedures.

29 patients who needed hospital treatments were arranged to receive required medical treatments at nearby hospitals. On 9 November, the Tatmadaw River-going Mobile Hospital Vessel (ShwePuzun) and river-

ine boat (Sagu) helped one pregnant woman from Myoma-Yelae-Kyun of Myanaung township to give birth successfully and that was the first time during the trip, it is reported.

Efforts Made to Increase Export Volume in the Fiscal Year of 2023-2024



During the tenure of the State Administration Council Government, efforts are being made to increase export volume via border trade posts and regular trade routes. As a result:

- Over a seven-month period, from 1st of April to 31st of October in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar earned a total of USD 375.14 million from a total export of 241,004.919 tonnes of aquatic products: USD 209.654 million from the export of 120,132.117 tonnes via regular trade routes and USD 165.486 million from the export of 120,872.802 tonnes via border trade posts.
- Over a seven-month period, from 1st of April to 31st of October in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar exported 583,683 tonnes of rice and broken rice, generating a foreign income of USD 271 million.
- Over a seven-month period, from 1st of April to 31st of October in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar exported a total of 1,319.02 tonnes of honey: 1,169.02 tonnes via regular trade routes and 150 tonnes via border trade posts, generating a foreign income of USD 1.978 million.
- From 1st of April to 3rd of November in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar exported a total of 974,696.306 tonnes of varieties of pulses: 840,226.108 tonnes via sea routes and 134,470.198 tonnes via border trade posts, generating foreign income of USD 817.904 million.

During 10 months this year, over 500 international cargo ships had docked at the Yangon International Port, it is reported.

- From 1st of April to 31st of October in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar earned a total of USD 375.14 million from a total export of 241,004.919 tonnes of aquatic products.
- From 1st of April to 31st of October in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar exported 583,683 tonnes of rice and broken rice, generating a foreign income of USD 271 million.
- From 1st of April to 31st of October in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar exported a total of 1,319.02 tonnes of honey, generating a foreign income of USD 1.978 million.
- From 1st of April to 3rd of November in the fiscal year of 2023-2024, Myanmar exported a total of 974,696.306 tonnes of varieties of pulses, generating a foreign income of USD 817.904 million.

Tatmadaw's Military Columns Crush KIA Group Carrying out Terrorist Acts and PDF Terrorists in Tigyaing, Continue Mine Clearance Work



KIA group and PDF terrorists with excessive force entered Tigyaing town in Sagaing Region and carried out a string of terrorist strikes such as abduction, extortion and killings of local people. Again, they

launched bombings and arson attacks on residential houses and departmental buildings there in order to paralyze the government's administrative machinery.

Since Tatmadaw's military columns,

in line with Rules of Engagement-ROE, conducted counter-terrorism operations against KIA group and PDF terrorists, military clashes broke out there. The military columns then retook Tigyaing town on 12 November.

On that day, terrorists fled in disorder after they had carried out a spate of terrorist strikes such as bombings at and arson attacks on residential houses and departmental buildings in Tigyaing town. During the incident, some security personnel fell in

the battle and some got injured.

Following the incident, the security personnel captured heavy weapons, small arms, ammunition, mortar shells, some dead bodies of terrorists and explosive materials. Further, the security personnel are continuing their efforts of cleaning debris, repairing schools, demining in the town in order to resettle local displaced persons, it is reported.

KIA Group and PDF Terrorists Using Residential Houses, and Departmental and Religious Buildings as Bunkers

The KNPP and so-called PDF terrorist groups using small arms and heavy weapons launched attacks on Loikaw University, a non-military target around 7:50 a.m. on 13 November, and also attempted to abduct academic staff and students in the University.

Promptly after receiving the information of the terrorists' nefarious attempts, the Tatmadaw personnel took careful steps by joining hands with the officials of the state governments to safely evacuate the education staff and students without any injury. In doing so, engagements broke out between the terrorist groups and security forces.

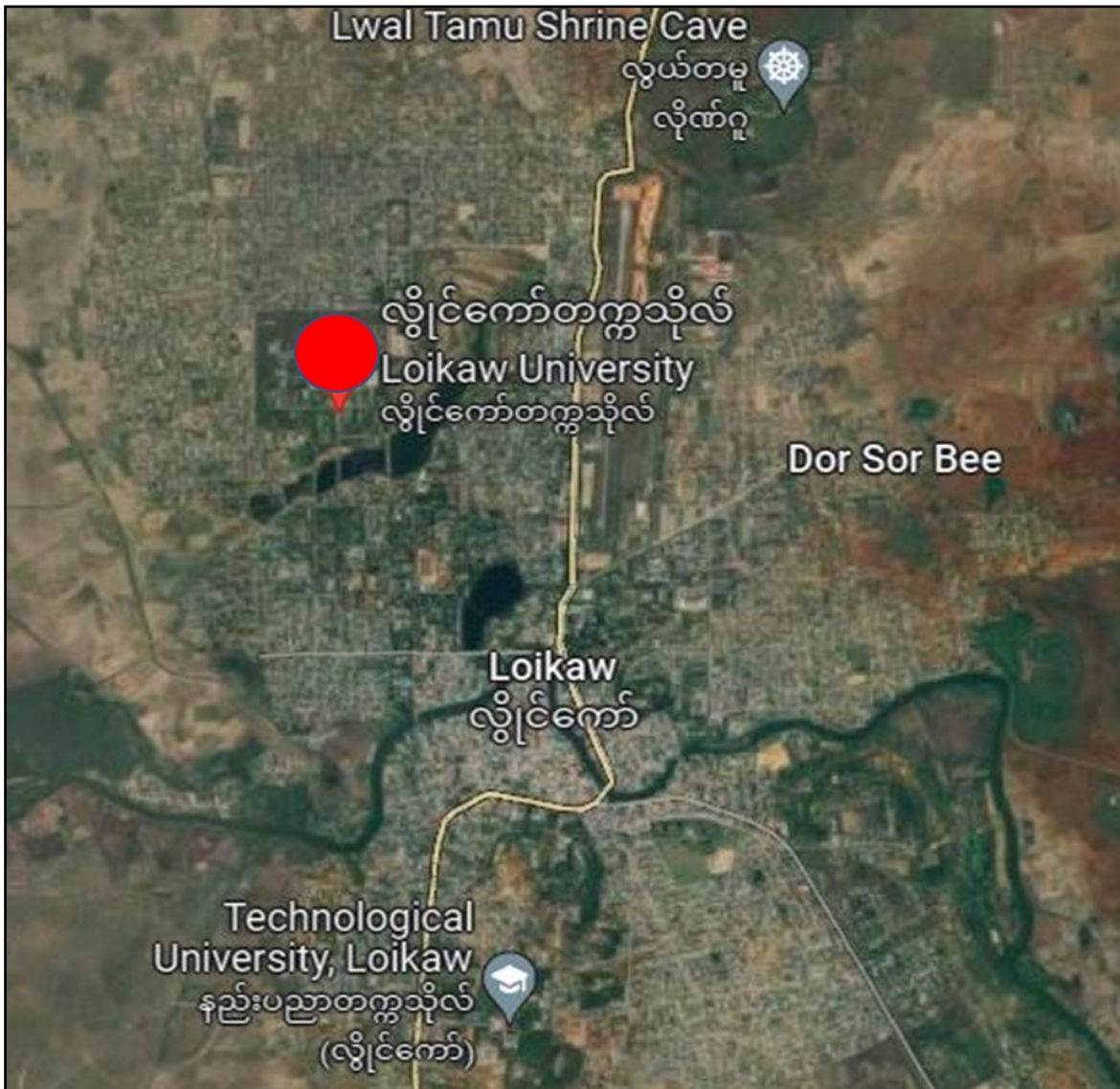
KNPP and so-called PDF terrorist groups, with the intent to disrupt the Government's administration mechanism in the Kayah State, have been carrying out various kinds of sabotage using public houses, religious, health and education facilities as covers since December 2021 in the vicinity of Loikaw where the state government holds reside. Moreover, they also fired heavy weapons targeting the crowds where people gathered to celebrate the opening ceremony of the archway that marked the 71st Anniversary of the Kayah State Day which fell on 15 January 2023. They committed the crime with the intent to cause mass killings

of the people and the attack killed and injured some local people.

The gruesome acts of KNPP and so-called PDF terrorist groups such as attempting to abduct the education staff and students and reckless shooting attacks would bring out benefits for no one but only the ignorant and inhumane crimes that would destroy the future of the country. Their acts destroyed the educational learning aid materials in the university and injured some military personnel. After the clashes, the bodies of the terrorists were left and their arms and ammunition were seized.

Security force members are, at present, carrying out necessary counter-terrorism and insurgency operations to respond to the acts of KNPP and so-called PDF terrorists. Accordingly, local people in the Kayah State are required to cooperate with security personnel in the measures for community peace and stability to ensure peace, stability and no public damage in the state, it is reported.

Damages of the railway track between Daik-U and Pyuntasa Stations in the remote mine attacks of the terrorists

Terrorists launched a remote mine attack on the railway track near bridge No (116/A) (mileposts 85/1 and 85/2) between Daik-U and Pyuntasa Stations on 14 November. The attack destroyed a concrete block at the edge of the bridge around three square feet. Moreover, three IEDs made of plastic piles were found between two railway tracks and four others under the bridge, and deactivated.

Local officials and security force members conducted security actions around the scene, and staff of the Myanmar Railway promptly repaired the damaged railway tracks.

From 1 February 2021 to 14 November 2023, terrorists have committed 128 times of setting mines on rail and in the areas of rail stations in the Myanmar railway network, 46 mine attacks on rail bridges and 12 arson attacks on railway stations and family housings of civil servants.

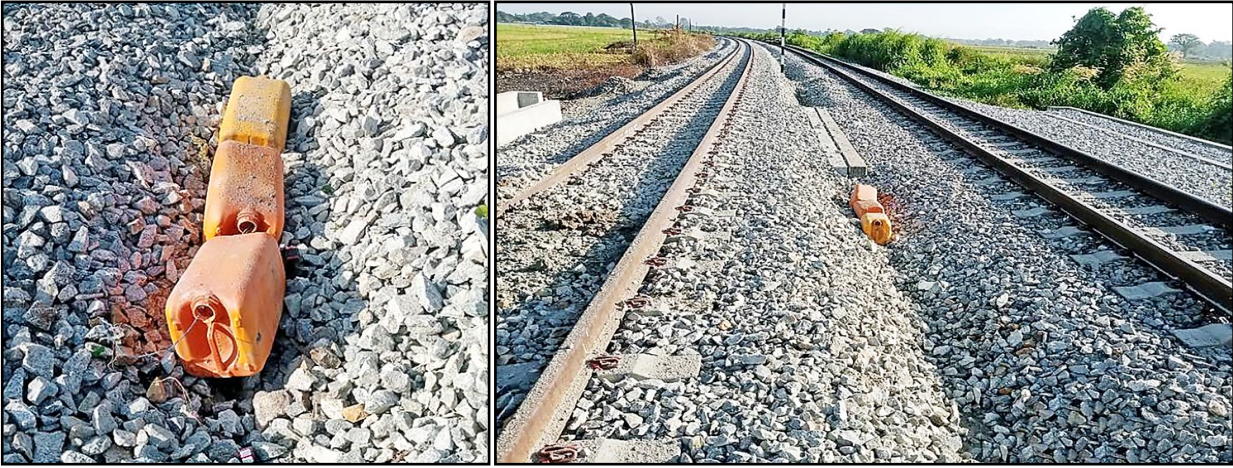
The State Government has deliberately focused on the projects of upgrading the railway infrastructures and rail transport systems to extend the number of regular running passenger and freight trains for the facilitation of public travel and goods flow. However, the terrorists repeatedly commit crimes to cause damage to State-owned locomotives, train carriages, passengers and goods harming the lives of the people. Moreover, the terrorists also commit similar crimes of blowing up the railway track to cause unnecessary delays on the Yangon-Mandalay railway upgrade projects. Seizures of Narcotic Drugs in October 2023

Members of anti-narcotic task force from Ministry of Home Affairs joining hands together with security personnel are putting stress on anti-narcotic measures, and the seizures of narcotic drugs in September 2023 were as follows:

- From 1 to 31 October, a total of 844 drug-related offenders including 714 males and 130 females were arrested along with a total of K35,224.827 million (over US\$ 16.773 million) worth narcotic drugs which are 78.9 kg of opium, 90.3 kg of heroin, 11,493,011 stimulant tablets, 0.03 kg of broken stimulant tablets, 2.8 kg of ICE, 57.3 kg of marijuana, 3 kg of opium oil, 0.03 kg of low quality opium, three opium leaves, 134.5kg of opium leave, 912.7 kg of opium powder, 10,795 Ecstasy tablets, 0.02 kg of bro-

ken Ecstasy tablets, 20.4 kg of Ketamine, 4,850 bottles of Ketamine, 83.2 kg of Happy Water, 48,000 capsules of tramadol, 2,000 vials of Midazolam injection, 25.9 kg of Caffeine, 13,500 liters of Methylamine, 11,520 liters of Ethyl Acetate, 3,800 liters of Benzene and 12,000 liters of Benzyl Cyanide were seized.

The arrested drug-related offenders were handed over to the relevant police stations and punitive actions are being taken against them in accordance with the law. Members of anti-narcotic drugs task force, joining hands with security force members, are making further efforts to identify and arrest drug-related offenders for the eradication of narcotic drugs.
